

SENSE programme

The SENSE program started in 2000

is focused on three main components:

- 1. awareness raising and educational activities:
- Research,
- Information, education, training
- Trainings for trainers
- Counseling and reintegration for victims of THB in cooperation with ADPARE, Bucharest and Filantropia, Timisoara
- Counseling, social and vocational orientation for individuals and groups (self evaluation, information about possible risks, skills and values, experiences and achievements) in the high risks situation
- 3. Networking with similar organizations from Romania and Europe

Information sessions in schools and voctional schools

in partnership with the Bucharest Regional Center of NAATIP, CARITAS Bucharest

- The main themes of discussions were focused on the current labour legislation for those interested in working abroad, ways of identifying a real job opportunity, how to avoid risky situation, by knowing the most common ways used by the traffickers to recruit a victim.
- These meetings gathered 200 students per year, with ages between 14-18 years.





National campaign for preventing trafficking for labor purposes – 2008-2009

"Trafficking in Human Beings is a reality! Make your decision today, not tomorrow!"

Its main objectives are to inform and to raise awareness among society representatives on the risks of human trafficking, to strengthen the capacity of self-protection, to reduce the vulnerability of categories of persons at risk (children, women, unemployed, persons with disabilities, elderly, asylum seekers), to reduce the demand for sexual exploitation of women and the demand for labor exploitation in general.

Victims' reintegration programme

- Empowering and vocational training for victims
- Individual and group counselling medical, psychological, judicial, vocational, religious, etc.

In 2009 (January-September)

- 60 victims from ADPARE Shelter Bucharest
- 20 victims from the Centre for Victims' Rehabilitation in Timisoara (near the Western border)
- Reintegration is a very long and hard process


The most important activity is the prevention and the raising awareness, which the Churches in cooperation with specialised NGOs can and should Provide
